

c) Swimming Pool - Douglas MacDonald - Peter Forbes read to Council the letter that he sent to Mr. & Mrs. MacDonald on May 5, 1989, indicating that he was being given a time limit (until June 30th) to take action regarding a fence around his pool. There has been no response from Mr. MacDonald to date, and Mr. Forbes asked for authority from Council to send him another letter giving him 10 days to construct fence — or else we will go to court — at Mr. MacDonald's expense.

MOTION: Councillor Johnstone moved that Council authorize Peter Forbes to write Mr. MacDonald a final letter asking him to erect a suitable enclosure around his Swimming Pool, and should he fail to act or make reasonable arrangements within 10 days of receipt of such letter, Mr. Forbes be authorized to proceed with Court Action against Mr. MacDonald. Council regrets the necessity of this action.

d) Irving Oil Properties - Peter Forbes inquired as to the action that had been taken, if any, on these properties. - 13 Hood July 1ST - Councillor Johnstone reported that he had presented the Certificate of Merit Award to Mr. Wayne Guptill, Chairman of Canada Day Celebrations, who accepted this Award on behalf of The Upper Nashwaak Lion's Club. Mr. Guptill, acting on behalf of The Upper Nashwaak Lion's Club, presented the Village of Stanley with a Wall Hanging, recognizing our assistance in the July 1st Parade. Councillor Freda Hood reported that the Nashwaaksis School Band would be interested in supplying music for the Parade next year.

- 19 Johnstone Emergency Response Numbers - Councillor Johnstone reported on speaking with Bruce Morrison of Oromocto concerning this topic. He stated that such a system would certainly enable Fire Department to more quickly locate properties, etc. Any company, such as Sears, who deliver to rural areas would certainly be aided by such a system. In Oromocto, the Fire Department controlled the setting up of the numbering system. It was reported that the cost of the Plates that would be erected on the property would be about \$1.25 or \$2.50 per plate, and can be purchased through Mr. Terry Youngblood, with the resident paying the cost of plate. Council felt that it certainly would be a good safety feature, and it would be pleasing for Village Council to initiate such a system, but it would require a tremendous amount of volunteer help. Chief Morrison of Oromocto offered his assistance, and said that he would come out and help us if we so desired. It was suggested that The Lion's Club may be interested in doing such a project, and Councillor Johnstone will inquire from them. MOTION: It was moved that Village Council will endorse the concept of an Emergency Response Number System and will discuss the project with The Upper Nashwaak Lion's Club. LEJ
