4	Bogisch	<p><u>Fundy Cable Representative - Mr. Clinton Lawrence</u> - He reported that the Boiestown and Astle area are now completed, and advised the first day of installation in the Stanley Area to be June 1st/89.</p> <p>He stated that NB Tel have completed their work in Williamsburg and most of Cross Creek, and expect to be in Stanley next week; these three are tied into one Cable System. The Cable System has 14 channels available. Mr. Lawrence circulated to Council pamphlets which listed the various Channels and answered some common questions concerning Cable.</p> <p>Village Cable are responsible for installation and operation, and after 30 days, it is turned over to Regional Office which is located in Fredericton, and as soon as complaints are received, they will try their best to be here within 45 minutes.</p> <p>Mr. Lawrence also stated that installation and free reception would be available until the end of June. (first 30 days) The regular Installation Charge is \$30.00, and monthly reception charge is \$20.25 plus tax (\$24.73). The price for a second outlet is \$3.50 plus tax a month.</p> <p>He advised that the cables are grounded and are very seldom ever affected by lightning. It is not necessary to disconnect during a thunderstorm.</p> <p>He displayed a map to Council which portrayed the boundaries that were being used in determining the areas to receive the benefit. He also advised that an Information Session would be held on May 27th, 1989 at Hillside General Store for any customers who have questions as to whether they will receive Cable, etc. He advised citizens to call if they wish to be connected to Cable. 5		<p><u>Library Presentation</u> - Councillor Hood reported that she had problems in contacting possible candidates to perform this work. She stated that she did speak with Roger Ross who was going to contact Kathi Dunphy himself. Council instructed Councillor Hood to proceed with her original plans.</p> <p>Mayor Smith reported that Rene Heggie recently passed away, and Council asked the Clerk to send a Sympathy Card to the family.</p>	CLERK

- 6 SMITH 1st Stanley Group Committee - Mayor Smith reported that he had spoken with Carol Dilworth concerning our lease on the property at Miramichi Lake. He advised her that Village would be interested in retaining the lease if there was going to be activity, because, in order to justify our expenses, we would like to see it utilized further.
Councillor MacNaughton advised that the Annual Banquet is to be held on May 28, 1989 at the Lion's Club at 5:00 P.M. They requested that a representative from Council be in attendance. n/a
- 7 SMITH Nashwaak Villa Board - The monthly meeting is to be May 16, 1989. Annual Meeting is scheduled for June. n/a
- 8 SMITH CN Property - Clerk reported that she had spoken with Peter Forbes and he had advised that Melvin Bartlett, Vincent Campbell and Robert Hughes and Rose Marie Campbell have decided not to purchase. n/a
- 9 SMITH Building By-Law - nothing further at this time. n/a
- 10 SMITH Anglican Church Hall - Mayor Smith recently spoke with Mr. R. Dunster who advised that they would be working on this project on Saturday, May 14, 1989. n/a
- 11 SMITH Parking on Sunday - Churches - Mayor Smith read to Council a letter received from St. Patrick's Church stating that they were in complete agreement that the double parking on the Hill on Sunday was a very dangerous situation, and asked if we might install a No-Parking sign in the area. Mayor Smith stated that he would obtain such signs, and a motion was made that the Mayor commence action.

- 12 SMITH Street Cleaning - Mayor Smith reported that completion had occurred today, and advised Clerk that hours for labour will be turned in. n/a
- 13 HOOD Dogs - Mayor Smith reported that he had received a visit from Mr. Eldon Sellick concerning his dog's value if he had to be tied. Mayor stated that he had received more complaints from citizens concerning wandering dogs. He explained to Councillor Johnstone that we have access to the County Dog Catcher in Fredericton, and when the problem arises, we try to address it.
After much discussion, it was decided that letters be sent to Mark Foreman and Gary Van Horne concerning their wandering dogs, and to enclose an excerpt from the appropriate By-Law. CLERK
- 14 BOGISCH Old Dumping Ground - this issue was discussed at length. This involves the property directly across from the D & J Enterprises Dumping Ground on the Irishtown Road. Council agreed that the Department of Transportation are guilty of contamination. Clerk was instructed to write a letter to Department of Environment asking them to look at the situation and assess it, with a copy of the letter to be sent to Mrs. Agnes Sellick, who has expressed much concern with this situation. - 15 SMITH Request From Firemen - 37 people were in attendance at this meeting. The Owners of "Something Special" catered to the meeting, and have been reimbursed for the total amount of their bill, \$105.00. n/a
- 16 HOOD Unsightly Premises - Councillor Hood expressed her concern with the D & J Enterprises Limited Dumping Ground on Irishtown Road, stressing the fact that the sight be protected by fence. Clerk will check with Peter Forbes to see if he has sent the letter to Mr. Douglas MacDonald concerning this Unsightly Premises and his Swimming Pool. Clerk also requested to send letters to Irving Oil Limited (2), ~~James Sparkes & Sons Ltd. (Garage)~~, Mr. Michael Gormley, and Mr. Joseph Hayes (Concerning Feed Shed). Clerk ✓
- 17 HOOD July 1st Parade - Councillor Bogisch stated that he had a Tape of Military marches which he had given to Alvin Bartlett that would last for 1½ hours. Mayor Smith reported that it is quite possible that we can obtain a Single Piper, but, if action was taken now, we may be able to get a larger group. (4 or 5 people) He estimated the cost to be approximately \$150.00. MOTION: Council agreed that Mayor Smith make the necessary contact regarding us obtaining a Piper and 3 or 4 others for the July 1st Parade, allowing a cost up to \$200.00. MOTION: Freda E. - 18 BOGISCH Cenotaph - Councillor Bogisch reported that the crosses are still lying there since last November. Council decided to discuss this topic under the Item of "ARBOR DAY." n/a
- 19 SMITH Letter From N.B. Safety Council Inc. - thanking us for sponsoring a student to attend this Seminar. (Jill Hurley) n/a
- 20 SMITH Letter - Canada Day Committee - concerning Certificate of Award - only one certificate per community. Much discussion took place, and it was decided that The Lion's Club were certainly worthy of such an Award. Clerk was requested to check with The Lion's Club to see if they may have received such a letter, and then to write the letter to the Canada Day Committee inquiring as to whether or not a Group could be nominated, or if it had to be an individual. MOTION: Council agreed that if The Lion's Club did not receive such a letter, we will inquire as to whether or not a Group may be nominated, and if so, we will nominate The Lion's Club. Clerk ✓
- 21 SMITH Response To Our appeal on Property Taxes - Anglican Hall - Mayor Smith read to Council the letter received advising that the assessment had been amended from \$19,600 to \$5,000. n/a

- 22 SMITH Arbor Day - May 18, 1989 - Mayor Smith read to Council the letter received from Canadian Forestry Association of New Brunswick advising that the 3rd Thursday in May is Arbor Day.
 Clerk reported that she had contacted Maxine Fullarton at the High School to see if any class would be interested in a clean-up of the Village as a Fund-Raiser. As yet, she has not responded. Councillor MacNaughton stated that if there wasn't a class that was interested, that perhaps the Scouts might possibly be interested. Clerk to check again with High School. Clerk ✓

- 23 Councillor Johnstone advised that there is such a program that would allow us to have 2 students to perform general clean-up in the Village. (Challenge 89). He had just recently spoken with Manpower, and they stated that there is 100% funding available for such a project. Clerk was requested to call Manpower and make inquiries, and ask that they send some Application Forms. She was also asked to mention that we have a Recreational Organization involving tennis, baseball, hockey, etc. If they advise that there is a short deadline for such a program, she is to contact Councillor Johnstone. - 23 HOOD Councillor Freda Hood extended, on Council's behalf, a warm "THANK YOU" to Councillor Bogisch for his valuable contribution to Council over the past few years, and also extended a hearty welcome to our newly elected Councillor, Lowell Johnstone. n/a
