### MINUTES

- 1 PRAYER FOR CIVIC AUTHORITIES
- 2 APPROVAL OF PREPARED AGENDA WITH TWO ADDITIONS - 8(h) Policing Letter, and 7(a) Special Meeting Between Dept. of Finance and Municipalities.  
MOTION: L. JOHNSTONE / F. HOOD (AS AMENDED) CARRIED.
- 3 APPROVAL OF PRE-CIRCULATED MINUTES OF OCTOBER 10TH AND OCTOBER 17TH, 1991.  
MOTION: F. HOOD / L. JOHNSTONE CARRIED.
- 4 RCMP--Cpl. Tom Armstrong was present and reported that Stanley has been very quiet during the last month. Reported re Criminal Code - one assault; one Property Theft over \$1,000; one Arson; one Property Damage under \$1,000- a total of 4 Criminal Code Offenses - all still ongoing. Under Provincial Statutes - one under the Mental Health Act (still ongoing); Total Traffic Offenses - two for the month, one speeding and one other moving traffic. He then asked Council if they had any concerns that they would like to bring to his attention. Council advised him that we now have a Liquor Outlet at Hillside General Store. Councillor Johnstone mentioned that he was going to introduce the Block Parent Program later on in the meeting. Councillor Freda Hood advised that the Local Community Policing Committee have reminded citizens in the Nashwaak Nose of the NO PARKING in the area between the Bank and the Post Office and adjacent to Sparke's Grocery, and also that a NO PARKING sign is to be erected in the area. Cpl. Armstrong advised Council to publish in The Royal Gazette concerning the No Parking Sign, thus making it law. Council to check with Peter Forbes as to the exact number of required times for publishing.

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D. PETER FORBES--reported to Council on various items:

a) Advised that he had written letter to the Minister of Transportation concerning the Water Situation on the Hill.

b) Asked for an update on Past Due Sewage Accounts.

c) Fisheries Building-Dept. of Public Works - still retaining holdback of \$3,000. He inquired as to whether or not the work to the road has been completed yet or not; result being that it has never been completely finished. He advised that improvements to this road should be arranged by Village.

c) Land Conveyance-Right-Of-Way--Mr. Forbes advised that Clerk had contacted him in regards to a letter received in response to Mayor Smith's request that price be \$1.00; this letter advising that we will not get the property for \$1.00, and the price is \$576.00. Peter Forbes suggested that, with authority from Village, he will finalize, accept and close this deal.

MOTION: Councillor Johnstone moved that Council instruct Peter Forbes to proceed with Land Conveyance with Department of Transportation for the sum of \$576.00.

Clerk issued cheque for \$576.00 to D. Peter Forbes In Trust at this time.

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FIRE DEPARTMENT--Fire Chief. Dexter Chaffey advised Council that the main priority is (1) Bunker Gear. as each Fireman now have to be outfitted with such. as to recommended standards: we now have 5-1/2 suits in stock, but we usually have 10 firemen attending a fire. No deadline has been set as yet for these requirements, but it is coming soon, and Worker's Compensation, at that time, will disallow benefits to a Fireman on duty without the required Suit. Mr. Chaffey expressed that he was very confused as to the cancellation of suits, etc. last year, and still feels that the \$1,360.00 Fire Dept. paid to Village was to be for suits. He advised that the costs of the suits were approximately \$1,000 each; Terry Youngblood stated that he could possibly purchase for \$800.00. Also, other requirements would be (2) Foam; (3) Hoses; (4) Breathing Apparatus Bottles. Mr. Chaffey did not have any figures to give us as those (Mark Foreman and Darrel Green) who had worked on the costs were not available for contact today or this evening. Peter Forbes suggested to Council that they get something on record to prove that attempts are being made to obtain funds to provide these suits for the Fire Department, as such a situation could turn out to be very serious. Clerk was instructed by Council to write or phone Worker's Compensation Board and Occupational Health & Safety Commission requesting an explicit statement as to the Safety Equipment requirements for a Volunteer Fire Department our size, and send a copy of this to Dexter Chaffey.

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## ITEM

Fire Chief reported that the Radio Station is now working great, since they put new antennas on trucks. He also reported on the condition of our older Fire Trucks and gave estimates for improvements. Council asked Fire Chief if he could give them a good breakdown of requirements with costs.

Councillor Johnstone later asked Clerk to send a thank you letter to Mr. Dexter Chaffey and Mrs. Ruth Russell for their attendance, advising them of the progress.

MOTION: Councillor Johnstone moved that Council request that Rob Costelo of NB Tel proceed with the implementation of Emergency Response Numbers for the Village of Stanley and as much outlying area as he can manage, and Clerk will advise him by letter of our support for this project..
