EMERGENCY RESPONSE NUMBERS--Mr. Rob Costelo, NB Tel, was present to explain to Council necessary preparation for the installing and completion of Civic Numbering in our area. He, for the past year, has been working on such a system in Doaktown, and reported that it should be complete in a very short time. He stated that the mapping is one of the largest parts of initiating the entire system, with assistance from Land Use Planning and Municipal Affairs (Eric Horncastle). He explained that a By-Law was passed in the Village of Doaktown concerning the Civic Numbering. He also stated that getting the numbers to the people requires a great deal of time. Stanley Village Council felt that, since we have so many outlying districts, we should haven no repetitions in numbering, as it would no doubt lead to confusion. Mr. Costelo informed Council that the costs are very minimal. He also suggested RCMP involvement and urged Council to use pressure with Government (MLA or MP). He estimated that the time length to complete such a project would be about one year.

RCMP POLICING COMMITTEE MEETING WITH COUNCIL

In Attendance: All of Council: Clerk: Thomas Cameron, Chairman; Hazen Webb; Wendy Waters; Franz Gehrig and Councillor Freda Hood.

The Policing Committee have been trying to arrange a meeting with Council for some time now and Council responded to their invitation with attendance this evening. The Committee were very disappointed that Corporal Ken Fraser, RCMP, did not show up for the meeting as promised, but decided to hold the meeting anyway as so much time has passed since the committee has been formed, with no consultations with Council. The committee expressed that their desire to meet with Council was to make sure that they did not do anything that was not approved by Council. One of their main concerns at this time is the parking on the corner, at the bottom of Stanley Hill, by the Bank and Sparke's Grocery. Council made them aware of our Community Improvement Program now in progress under the direction of Daniel Glenn Ltd. and explained that they are going to try to improve the same situation. Much discussion took place concerning the dangers, etc. that this area promotes. Fines for illegal parking were also discussed. In conclusion, the Committee agreed that they would present a report to Council with suggested recommendations, and Council may respond with or without action. The committee agreed that a friendly reminder be published in The Nashwaak Nose, making residents aware of this problem and asking that they refrain from illegal parking in that area, and possibly warning them that more drastic measures may have to be taken, such as fines, etc. All were in agreement that the Committee first publish information on same, then Village publish, and ask Department of Transportation to act.

Other topics discussed were Drug and Alcohol Abuse, Traffic Violations, Theft, Lifeline, 911 For The Elderly, etc.
