1 PRAYER FOR CIVIC AUTHORITIES

2 APPROVAL OF PREPARED AGENDA:

MOTION: F. HOOD \ E. MACNAUGHTON \ CARRIED.

3 MARK FOREMAN - FIRE CHIEF

1) He distributed copies of the Blue Numbering System, one copy to the R.C.M.P. and one copy to NB Tel.

2) He advised that Kirk MacDonald was the winner of the Barbecue.

3) He inquired about whether there would still be a road down to the river for filling fire trucks, as tractor work is now being done in that area. Mayor Ross advised him that the road would still be there.

4) He stated that the Fire Dept. would flush out the lines as soon as the weather changes for the better.

5) He advised that \$398 was taken in from tickets sold on the Barbecue, and that \$550 was made from the Yard Sale. With this money, they may purchase a Bunker Suit.

He circulated to council a copy of last month's report and explained it to them.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATIVE GROUP & R.C.M.P. - meeting at Stanley High School May 25th at 7:00 PM. Councillor Freda Hood prepared this report and commented on the Crime Stoppers Program having been introduced at the High School. She stated that the RCMP had held a volleyball game with grade 12 students at noon one day, which was very well attended by students and teachers.

The youth member who has joined the group is Jennifer Dysart, who plans to arrange a Softball Game with the RCMP.

The No-Parking, Main Street, will be enforced June 1st, and any complaints concerning same will have to be dealt with through Village Council.

She advised that Door-to-Door Salespeople must require a license from Direct Seller's Act, which can be asked to be shown.

Police Control for Graduation Night will be forthcoming.

RCMP were advised that the new hang-out place seems to be back on the grounds by the Agrena, especially on the week-ends.

She advised that John Aker, representing Lion's Club, is going to see if they would be interested in putting on a Fall '93 Seminar for the public with Crime Stoppers.
