1 PRAYER FOR CIVIC AUTHORITIES

2 APPROVAL OF PREPARED AGENDA

MOTION: F. HOOD \ B. MACDONALD \ CARRIED.

3 INFORMATION ON STANLEY AMBULANCE SITUATION

Mr. John Burke and Mrs. Sharon Flynn, representing the Nashwaak Villa, were invited to attend meeting to enlighten us on this situation. Mr. Burke read a letter from a group of Villa workers who stated that they did not wish to volunteer Ambulance Services any more. Villa Staff do not desire to continue this service as they do not feel that they have appropriate training and would rather not be caught in a lawsuit situation. Mr. Burke commented that most volunteers of the area seem to have the feeling that the Villa are responsible for Ambulance Services during the day, which, he stated, is not the case, as the Villa are not required to offer Ambulance Services. He stated that there are only three (3) volunteers left - Peggy Anderson, Stanley Campbell and Sheila Foreman. He advised that on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, Emergency Calls are covered (6:00 AM - 6:00 PM), but calls received on Thursday and Friday are still up in the air. Mr. Burke stated that they have held several meetings in different areas, but have not come up with enough volunteers. This being the case, Council agreed that they need to get some people from the Village to offer as a Volunteer during the day, and to also be prepared to take some training. Will update at next month's meeting.

4 **MARK FOREMAN - FIRE DEPT.**

He reported that they have lost one of their pagers, but are still trying to locate it. He also advised that the Fire Department is also in desperate need for volunteers, as they, at the present time, only have nine (9) volunteers. He stated that the summer was very quiet, but Halloween was very busy, with 22 calls on Saturday Night, and 6 calls outside the Village on Sunday Night. He also advised that he had ordered the necessary MSA (Breathing Apparatus) at a cost of \$2,400.00. He also informed Council that they have been rechecking the Blue Numbering System and have about thirty (3) numbers to reorder. Mark Foreman will bring an ad to the office to be placed in The Daily Gleaner, asking for Volunteers for Fire Department.

5 **R.C.M.P. - Const. J.M.P. GERVAIS**

He stated that Friday Night (Halloween Week-End) was very quiet, and briefed Council on the incident at Edison Palmer's on Saturday Night. Mr. Palmer received a threatening letter from an anonymous person, of which he gave Clerk a copy, and she in turn circulated copies to Council. Const. Gervais agreed with Council that no person should be permitted to write such a letter to someone and then sign another name, such as The Village, which was done in this case, but it is very hard to prove anything with just a sheet of paper. Const. Gervais reported that he had spent the entire night at Palmer's residence as they were very afraid of being burned out. Joey Palmer is supposed to be returning to Ontario very soon, so perhaps things will quiet down for a while.

Councillor Freda Hood reported that she had received complaints from citizens of young people hanging out at the Catholic Churchyard in the evenings, and leaving a mess of bottles, etc. to be cleaned up the next morning.

SNOW REMOVAL - 1993 - 1994

Received 2 Tenders for each Job Description, two from Douglas MacDonald of D & J Enterprises Ltd. and two from Dennis Foreman. They were as follows:

D & J Enterprises	- Village	- \$4,000.
D & J Enterprises	- Office Yard	- \$ 395.
Dennis Foreman	- Village	- \$4,950.
Dennis Foreman	- Office Yard	- \$ 250.

Council deliberated on this for some time, as they were not clear on Douglas MacDonald's Tender for the Village, as he stated that should snow have to be hauled away through the winter, it would be done at a rate of \$75.00 per hour for Loader and Trucking. It appeared to Council that this was over and above the Tender Price

of \$4,000. Mayor Ross tried to contact Mr. MacDonald to clarify things, but was unable to do so. This being the case, and Council fearing that if extra snow needed to be hauled away, it could possibly be very costly, they agreed to accept both tenders from Mr. Dennis Foreman.

A Motion was made by Freda Hood to accept the Tender from Douglas MacDonald for Village Snow Removal, but she rescinded her Motion, due to lack of clarification of Tender.
