A presentation on District Policing was given by Rick Daigle through Video-On-Screen, describing and explaining many aspects of this Division and answering some of our questions. He described the "J Division" as including 3 Sub-Divisions; 38 Rural Detachments and 12 Municipal Detachments. Federal Policing consists of 125 members; Municipal 79 members; Administrative Duties 59 members; and Provincial Policing 437 members. Out of this total 437 members, only 344 of them are first line response.

In answer to the question "WHY DISTRICT POLICING"?, some of the following answers were given - To find new ways of doing things; To practice risk management; To provide better policing services to clients; to be ready for innovative changes by the Province; and to make better use of existing forces at our cost.

Mayor Ross asked the question - "Is it possible for us to get a detachment in Stanley"?. Mr. Daigle explained that Residency would be a big problem, and stated that for the RCMP to build a home, it would just be too expensive, but if the Municipality would provide the house, then they would no doubt find a Police Officer to accommodate it. He stated that the necessary requirements for an office would be a space about 16' x 20', a telephone, a fax machine, a computer and a breathalyzer.

At present, there are four (4) proposals of areas for the District Policing, being: Burtt's Corner (geographical choice), Harvey, Baie. ste. Anne and Nackawic.

Council thanked the RCMP Representatives and assured them that they would be putting their heads and thoughts together, and would be responding in the form of a proposal to this presentation very soon.



UNPLEASANT ODOR AT MARVEN DUNPHY RESIDENCE
