APPROVAL OF PREPARED AGENDA

FIRE DEPARTMENT

M. Edmondson reported that the new Rescue Van is ready and on the road, with estimated value at \$40,000. He presented 2 bills to Council, one for \$682.93 for lettering for the Van, and \$38.85 owed to C. J. Munn for hydrostatic Test. He reported that he obtained a price of \$288.00 to repair both overhead doors halfway down on the Fire Hall.

MOTION: Council moved that the Fire Department get both Fire Department Overhead Doors repaired halfway down with steel reinforcement at a price of \$288.00.

MOTION: B. MACDONALD \ M. FOREMAN \ CARRIED.

He reported that there had been only 2 fires in the past month, one at the School and one on the Glen Road. He also stated that there is a Fire School coming up in September or October, and that they will be sending someone to attend at a price of \$20 per person. He would also like to hold an Air Brake Course in the fall.

Diane & Stanley (Chub) MacKinnon wish to sponsor a Dinner on September 16th for the Fire Department and possibly have a Cornboil with Ham, Rolls, Dessert, etc. and perhaps a 50/50 Bingo and music for a Dance, hopefully to be held at the Stanley Park.

Fire Safety Week is the 1st or 2nd week in October.

He hopes that there will be a Fund started soon for the possible purchase of the Jaws of Life.

Mayor Ross advised that the Gazebo's and one Picnic Table for Walking Trail will be delivered the week of August 14, 1995 by Mr. Gerald Bavis, and he is also going to construct the two signs for the Walking Trail. The Apartment Steps are completed and also the Park Benches and Waste Receptacles, ready to be installed.

Councillor Barb MacDonald stated that Environment contacted her to advise that the little green building at the entrance to the Bridge is ours if we so wish. Council agreed that it would be very useful for storing Lawn Mower, Shovels, Rakes, etc.

Cst. Spence suggested to Council that if we acquire a Detachment here in Stanley, it would happen prior to March 1996. Mayor Ross will continue to keep in contact with the RCMP regarding same.



