R.C.M.P.

Representative Const. M.R.A. Sills attended meeting and advised Council that Staff Sgt. Ouellette is still working towards the possibility of obtaining a Detachment in the Stanley area. She also reported that the Bicycle Rodeo is still on for May 28, 1995 and that Const. Claire Cole is in charge.

Council expressed complaints concerning reckless drivers being seen and heard in the area again, and after much discussion, Council agreed to have warning letters sent to the following: Justin Thomas, Jamie Sopha, Robert Allen and Mitch O'Donnell. Complaints of young people gathering in the Catholic Church Yard on Stanley Hill (Main Street) were also passed on to the RCMP, and requested that they make periodic checks on this area.

Const. Sills advised that she brought with her this evening the lights for the new Van (Fire Dept.) She also stated that enforcement of parking violations over at the famous Corner (Bank) will be put in effect right away. She circulated copies of the Police Report for the area for the month of April to Council.
